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# Notice of Proposed Increases to North Tahoe Public Utility District Water and Wastewater Rates

The North Tahoe Public Utility District Board of Directors is considering increases to its sewer and water monthly services charges and water consumption rates. Consistent with the requirements of Proposition 218, all property owners are being notified of the proposed rate increases. Any written protests to the proposed rate increases must be submitted to the District no later than October 16, 2007 by noon.

Much of our existing infrastructure is approaching its service life and must be replaced. The District has adopted a 5 Year Focus Capital Improvement Program which is currently underway. To continue planned replacement at a prudent pace, it is necessary to An old, leaky and undersized water pipe. increase rates. District sewer rates are partially supported by



property taxes. The water utility relies exclusively on the revenue derived from customer charges, there is no property tax support for water operations. As a public agency, by state law, the District may not collect more revenue than is necessary to recover annual costs of providing the utility services, including infrastructure replacement.

#### **Important Note:**

There are two private water companies, Agate Bay Water Company and Fulton Water Company, that operate within the boundaries of the NTPUD. If you are served by either of these companies, you will only be impacted by the sewer rate increase.

The District's proposed adjustment to base monthly sewer and water service charges is triggered by many existing factors including:

- the escalation in the cost of construction materials such as steel, PVC pipe, concrete, copper, and petroleum product costs for infrastructure replacement and operations
- rising chemical supply costs
- significant increase in electricity costs
- spike in fuel prices
- labor, benefit and medical insurance premium costs
- stringent State Regional Water Quality Board and Department of Public Health standards

## Capital Projects are the focus for raising water and sewer rates.

The District's proposed system replacement fee will provide a dedicated funding source to implement the District's "Five Year Focus" capital infrastructure program for water and wastewater.

Specific projects include an average expenditure of \$800,000 per year in water line replacement projects to address aging and leaking water lines, to provide fire flow improvements, and the construction of additional water storage to meet customer needs and improve fire protection capabilities.

The NTPUD has a very old utility system with over 49 miles of water distribution pipelines, some of which were originally built to serve summer seasonal cabins. Many existing water lines are undersized and do not meet industry standards nor provide reliable flows for modern fire protection. Also, many water lines are located in backyard easements which limit accessibility by crews for maintenance and repair and do not allow for placement of fire hydrants along these lines. Existing water storage does not meet current industry standards based on user demand and fire flow protection requirements. The District is considering a \$20.00 per month water system replacement fee which would be earmarked only for capital construction projects.

The NTPUD sewer system has over 77 miles of collection mains and 6 miles of force main from Secline Avenue up to Dollar Hill with four primary pump stations to move sewage to the Tahoe Truckee Sanitation Agency (TTSA) facility in Truckee. The District's "Five Year Focus" includes the expenditure of \$1.2 million a year to provide for the rehabilitation of the four pump stations, which date back to 1969, with modern pump technology sized to current sewer

flow, redundant emergency back up power supply, televising the force main to begin evaluation and planning for future replacement of the force main as appropriate based on actual condition of the line, and replacement of aging gravity sewer collection lines, laterals and manholes. *The District is considering* 

a \$7.50 per month sewer system replacement fee which would be earmarked only for capital construction projects.

The District must replace or retrofit most of its existing diesel heavy equipment fleet, permanent and portable emergency generators used to power our sewer and water pump stations and water treatment plant when there is a loss of electricity. The cost to comply with new State of California Air Quality Control Standards is estimated at \$1.5 million. Failure to comply exposes the District to fines of up to \$1,000 per day. To fund this unscheduled equipment replacement, the District is considering implementing a State/Federal Mandate Fee of \$1.41 per month for each water and sewer account for a 10 year period.

What are the proposed rates and who pays for what? The proposed water and sewer rates for the next three years are shown in detail in the charts following.

The average single family residential sewer amount will increase to \$17.66 as of December 1, 2007; to \$18.31 as of January 1, 2009; and \$19.06 as of January 1, 2010.

### **Proposed Commercial Sewer Rates**

The proposed commercial sewer rate adjustment is to eliminate the credit for commercial accounts that is currently in effect. There would be no rate increase, per se, however there will be an increase in commercial bills due to the elimination of the credit. The exact amount of credit elimination is depending on the historical credit initially provided. Commercial rates will be based on the table below.

**Section B** rates are subject to a credit based upon the number of Equivalent Single Family Units (ESFU's) existing on a parcel. The annual sewer rate shall be reduced by \$49.50 per ESFU provided that no rate shall be less than zero. ESFU's shall be determined by the following chart.

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The average single family water bill with no additional commodity charge will increase to \$59.88 as of December 1, 2007; to \$62.51 as of January 1, 2009; and to \$65.27 as of January 1, 2010. The amount of the water bill is dependent on the actual amount of water consumed.

The Board of Directors is considering under separate action, adoption of increased sewer and water connection fees that are paid by new customers connecting into the water and sewer systems. The Board is also considering implementation of a new Increased Capacity/Demand fee for water of up to \$8943.00 per single family residential unit to fund the costs of water improvements required by new development or redevelopment.

#### Rate increase approval process.

The NTPUD Board of Directors will hold a public hearing at the Board of Directors meeting to be held on **Tuesday**, **October 16**, **2007** at the North Tahoe Community Conference Center at 6:00 pm. The Board will consider public comments, as well as any written protests, against the proposed water/sewer rate increases that were received

The NTPUD must receive a protest letter or postcard no later than noon on October 16, 2007. All protest letters or postcards will be provided to the Board prior to or during the October 16, 2007 public hearing.

All persons wishing to be heard on this matter may be present at the public hearing. The Board of Directors, after the close of the public hearing, will establish the rates and charges for the remainder of 2007, 2008, and 2009, and 2010. Rates and charges may be less than, but may not exceed, the proposed increases set forth herein.
