While many water regulations will no longer be strictly enforced, conservation now will benefit us all in the future. The 20% reduction by 2020 rule must still be met for the District to be eligible for state grants in the future.

The following uses for water remain **PROHIBITED** by the State of California:

- Washing sidewalks, driveways, and other hard surfaces
- Outdoor irrigation during and up to 48 hours after moderate to heavy snow and/or rainfall
- Excessive irrigation run-off to driveways, roads, sidewalks, and other non-landscaped areas
- Non-commercial washing of privately owned vehicles, RVs, trailers, bikes, and boats except from a bucket and with a hose fitted with a shut-off nozzle
- Failing to display prominent notices in hotel guest rooms indicating that guests may choose to not have towels and linens laundered daily
- Serving drinking water to customers, unless requested, in restaurants and other food service establishments
