North Tahoe Public Utility District Announces Recreation and Parks Community Meeting

Kings Beach, CA – The North Tahoe Public Utility District would like to invite all residents to a Recreation and Parks Community Meeting on Tuesday, September 20 from 5:30 – 7:30 PM at the North Tahoe Event Center. This Open House style meeting will provide residents with an opportunity to give input on priorities for the Recreation and Parks Department.


The Boys and Girls Club of North Lake Tahoe will also be in attendance as the District's main recreation provider to give information on the programs they offer. Other recreation providers and partners are also being invited to attend.

In December 2010 the North Tahoe Public Utility District Recreation and Parks Commission was disbanded due to a lack of volunteers willing to serve on the Commission. The Commission was the link between the Board and the community on matters of Parks. In order to keep those connections with the community active, the Board committed to providing an opportunity for residents to give input on projects, funding priorities and other items related to Parks. This meeting will give residents an opportunity to comment on topics such as maintenance and capital priorities, launch ramp hours, to name just a few.

The North Tahoe Public Utility District provides sewer and water service to the residents of Kings Beach, Tahoe Vista, Carnelian Bay, Cedar Flat and Agate Bay. The District owns, manages and maintains the North Tahoe Regional Park in Tahoe Vista which provides

recreation opportunities to residents and visitors. In addition, the District owns and/or maintains all of the public beaches in the District including Kings Beach State Recreation Area, Tahoe Vista Recreation Area, and Secline Beach to name just a few. The North Tahoe Event Center in downtown Kings Beach is also owned and managed by the District.
