

TVRA PARK RULES & REGULATIONS

- This beach is an active boat launch. Stay aware and only swim in marked areas.
- No open flames or charcoal grills.
 Propane grills allowed, except during a Fire Weather Watch or Red Flag Warning.
- Gatherings of over 20 people require a permit. Respect reservations by staying clear of marked areas.
- No overnight camping or parking. Be bear aware, do not feed wildlife.
- No dogs or glass on the beach.
 This is a smoke and vape free recreation area. Please place your trash in the receptacles.
- Tie-up of any watercrafts requires NTPUD approval. Please see kiosk attendant boat launch for details.

CLEAN. DRAIN. DRY.

- All boats must have a Tahoe Seal and sticker prior to launch.
- Clean all surfaces that touch water; Dispose of vegetation, mud, and sand; Remove any contaminants.
- Drain water from the bilge; Empty ballast tanks, live wells, and sea strainers; Lower the outdrive to drain ALL water from intakes.
- Dry all compartments; Dry life jackets, ropes, and toys. Any water present during the inspection will result in a decontamination and a decontamination fee.
